12. Discuss the indications for reverse shoulder arthroplasty in patients with cuff intact glenohumeral osteoarthritis.

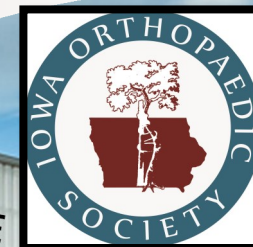
